New dates are now available for the popular six session Rising to the Challenge course, run by Autism West Midlands. These sessions help family carers understand their child's autism. This course recently won best Parent Training and Support Programme in the Social Care Awards 2017.

The six sessions cover 1. Autism as a spectrum, 2. Sensory issues, 3. Communication and behaviour, 4. Social skills, 5. Anxiety and anger and 6. Happiness and wellbeing.

The course is held at the Lantern in Shrewsbury and there is a choice of daytime and evening sessions. Places are free and suitable for any Shropshire family carers who have a child with autism or being assessed for autism (diagnosis not needed).
