
part in and Mrs Lenny the Lion will also be making an appearance! Please note that all children must be accompanied by an adult. We look forward to seeing everyone at the picnic.


#### Boys U11 Kerrison Jones 'B' Team Cup

#### Send children home if they become ill at school, not just if they are physically vomiting.

The welfare of all our children is vital important to us at HJS and we monitor closely all children who say they feel unwell. We look closely for signs that the child has a temperature, which is one key indicator that a child is poorly. If a child has a temperature, is sick or is very clearly unwell school will phone a parent/carer straight away. If symptoms are less obvious we will quite often ask children to have a drink of water and some fresh air to see if this makes them feel better. If symptoms persist we will contact parent/carers for advice. We aim to work closely with parents as we appreciate how tricky it can be to leave work during the day unless it is for a serious illness/accident.

# What could school do better?

# First Aid is inconsistent, phone calls for head injuries please.

Our team of first aiders follow strict guidelines when completing first aids. All children who present with first aid concerns are assessed by a first aider who will treat the child, find out about the accident and record all of this on a slip. These slips are then stored in school and a copy is sent home with the child. If a first aid is more serious the first aider will seek a second opinion from another first aider. With more serious first aids which include head injuries, serious cuts, long lasting or extreme nose bleeds, suspected strains or breaks and injuries to the face, a parent/carer will be contacted to inform them and to see if they can come into school. Again we know how difficult it can be to leave work during the day unless it is for a serious injury so we will often offer to monitor the child and ring parents/carers again if needed. Very occasionally a first aid is judged as needing professional medical treatment, in these cases an ambulance is requested and the parent/carer notified. At this point two first aiders would be in attendance with the child and a member of the senior leadership team. At all times we try to educate the children at HJS on how to keep themselves and others safe so the number of first aids is low.
